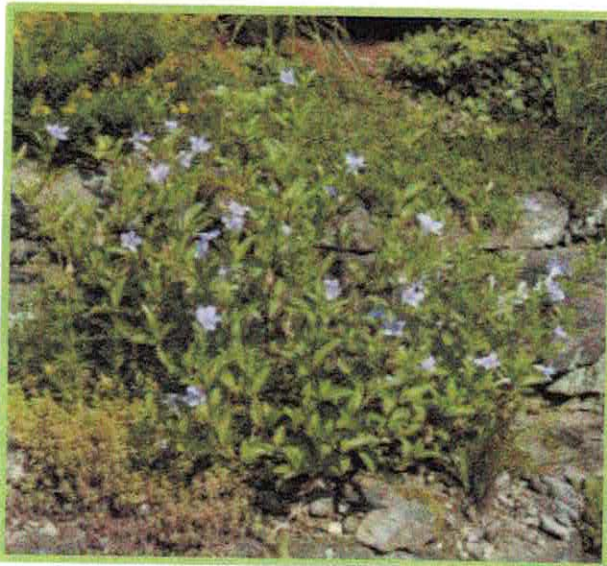


Ruellia humilis

Common Name: Wild Petunia

Wild Petunia's claim to fame is its lovely violet flower trumpets, a hummingbird favorite! Seldom growing more than a foot tall, this rare plant is perfect for dry, hot locations such as rock gardens and dry sandy or rocky soils. *Ruellia humilis* also thrives in well-drained loam. A drought-tolerant prairie native, with delightful small violet blue petunia flowers for a long time in mid summer. Compact (great in pots!) and very easy to grow. Great choice for a height-restricted meadow. Wild Petunia self seeds with seeds that explode, making it able to hold its own with larger, aggressive plants.
